Micah Yoder and Mr. Stein were in charge of parking cars at Leadership Day and Migration Sensation.




We held our first Parent Open House at the end of March. We had fun showcasing our 7 Habits to our families.




The College of Wooster physics class came and shared with the 5th graders about Newton's Laws, air pressure, light, sound, electricity and magnets..
