



Miss Ohio, Sarah Hider, came to help us with our 7 Habits kick-off assembly.




Students and staff celebrated Superhero Day in honor of making our goal of 10,000 purple tallies.




Wesley Barnes and Dirk Beery transitioned parents and students during Triway's Literacy Night recently held at Wooster Township.
